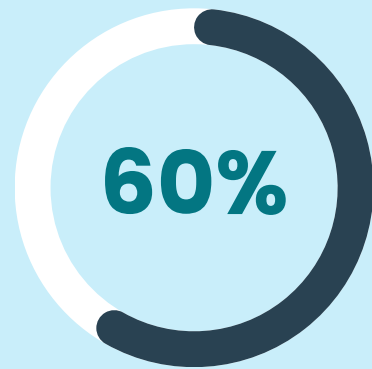

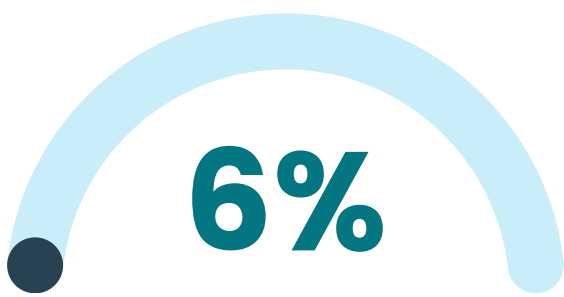
Rates of uninsured residents fell 20 percentage points among Hispanic adults and 11 percentage points among Black adults in expansion states, compared to 7 points for both demographics in non-expansion states
