

OLDER, UNINSURED FLORIDIANS:

How does Medicaid
expansion impact me?



STATES CHOOSE

States decide whether to expand their Medicaid programs. Florida is one of only 12 states refusing federal funding to cover uninsured adults under age 65.

NEW COVERAGE FOR OLDER ADULTS

If Florida were to expand Medicaid, 400,000 residents ages 50-64 could benefit from new access to health coverage.



BETTER OUTCOMES WITH INSURANCE

By the time they reach 65, and become eligible for Medicare, those who have lacked health coverage may have gone years without doctors visits, preventive care, and the early diagnosis and treatment of health problems.
