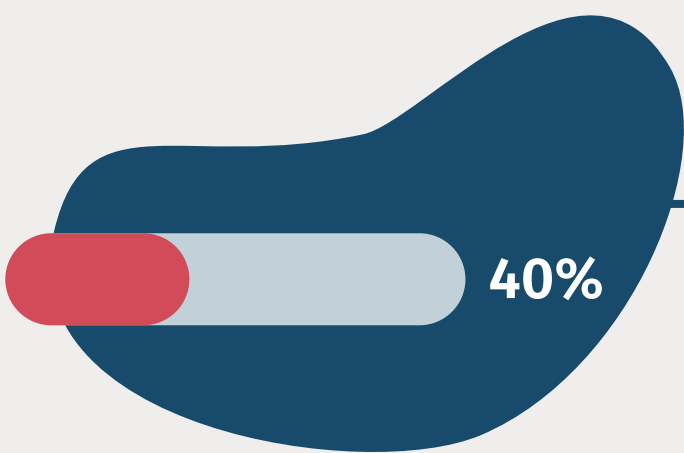
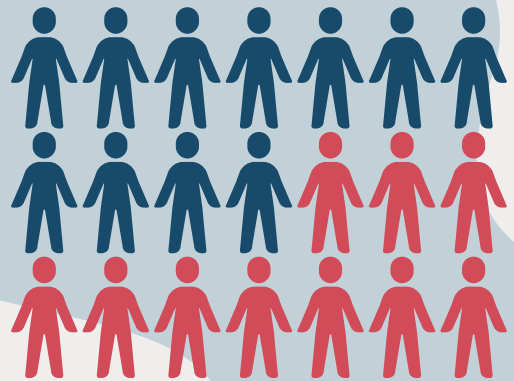


# Floridians Rely on Medicaid

Medicaid provides full healthcare coverage to millions of low-income children, disabled adults, and seniors. In addition, it fills in gaps in Medicare coverage and covers nursing facility care as well as other long-term care expenses.

## Medicaid Population

3.9 million Florida residents, including 2.1 million children, more than 700,000 seniors, and over 350,000 adults with disabilities, are enrolled in a Medicaid program.

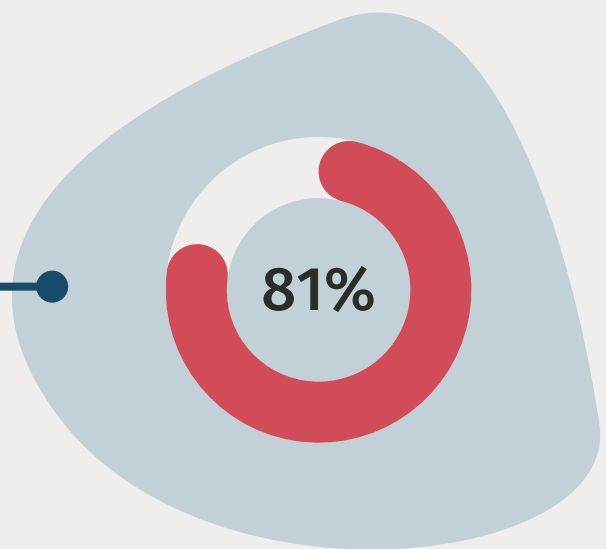


## Children & Medicaid

Approximately 40% of all children in Florida receive healthcare coverage through Medicaid.

## Children, Seniors, and Disabled Adults

81% of individuals enrolled in Medicaid in Florida are children, seniors, or adults with disabilities.



## Nursing Home Residents

Medicaid's payments cover the care of more than half of all nursing home residents in Florida

## Federal Medicaid Cuts Would:

- Do nothing to lower healthcare costs or increase access to care
- Devastate the state budget, putting other funding priorities, like education, at risk
- Undermine financial stability of the health system
- Jeopardize health coverage for millions of children and families, seniors, and people living with disabilities
