Privacy Policy

The Florida Health Justice Project values your privacy and is committed to protecting your personal information. We have created this Privacy Policy to provide transparency on how your information is collected, used, and shared when you visit our website. This Privacy Policy applies to the Florida Health Justice Project's online data collection and sharing practices for our website located at www.floridahealthjustice.org (the "Website").

By using this Website, you agree to the practices and policies outlined in this Privacy Policy. If you do not agree, please do not use the Website. We may update this policy from time to time, so we encourage you to review it periodically.

Information We Collect

Personal Information You Provide: You may visit our Website anonymously without providing personal information. However, some services require personal data. Personal information refers to data that can identify or contact you. Please do not send confidential information via this Website or through email.

Donate: If you choose to donate through our Website, we collect your name, address, and credit card details to process your donation. We do not store your credit card information unless you opt for recurring donations.

Newsletter: Visitors may sign up for our e-newsletter. If you subscribe, we collect your name and email address. You can unsubscribe at any time via the link in the footer of our emails.

Contact Us: If you contact us through any of our Website's forms, we collect your email address and any other information you choose to provide. We will use this information to respond to your inquiries.

Non-Personal Information We Collect: We also gather non-personal information through automated means, such as Google Analytics, to track website usage. This data may include the pages you visit, your browser type, IP address, and other similar data. This information is used in aggregate form to improve the Website's functionality.

Cookies: We may use cookies to enhance the user experience. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your device when you visit a website. You can disable cookies in your browser settings, but doing so may limit certain Website features.

Web Beacons: Our Website may contain web beacons (clear GIFs) to help us monitor user activity. These allow us to track the number of visitors and the effectiveness of email campaigns. Web beacons do not collect personally identifiable information.

IP Addresses: We may collect IP addresses and related data, such as the type of browser and operating system used, to analyze website traffic and improve user experience.

How We Use Your Information

We do not sell, rent, or trade your personal information. The information you provide will only be used for the purposes you intended, such as responding to inquiries or processing donations. Aggregate data collected through automated tools like cookies is used to analyze trends and improve our services.

Sharing Your Information

We may share your information with third-party service providers who help us operate our Website and process payments (e.g., donation processors). These parties are required to keep your information confidential and only use it for the intended purpose. We may also disclose your information when required by law or to protect the rights and safety of the Florida Health Justice Project and its users.

Safeguarding Your Information

We implement reasonable administrative, technical, and physical security measures to protect your personal information from unauthorized access, disclosure, or alteration. However, please be aware that no security measures can guarantee absolute protection. When using third-party social media platforms linked from our Website, please exercise caution as your information may be accessible to other users.

Children's Privacy

The Florida Health Justice Project's Website is not intended for children under the age of 13. We do not knowingly collect personal information from children. If we become aware that we have collected personal information from a child under the age of 13 without parental consent, we will delete that information.

Third-Party Websites/Links

Our Website may contain links to third-party websites, such as social media platforms and external resources. The Florida Health Justice Project is not responsible for the privacy practices or the content of these websites. Please review their privacy policies before providing any personal information.

Use of the Website from Outside the United States

Our Website is intended for users located in the United States. If you access the Website from outside the U.S., you consent to the transfer of your information to the U.S., where the privacy laws may differ from those in your country.

Changes to Our Privacy Policy

We reserve the right to update this Privacy Policy at any time. Please review it periodically to stay informed of any changes. The effective date of this policy is September 25, 2024.

SMS and Text Messaging Privacy

Florida Health Justice Project may collect mobile telephone numbers and SMS consent information from individuals who voluntarily agree to receive text messages from our organization.

Mobile telephone numbers, SMS opt-in information, and SMS consent records will not be sold, rented, traded, or shared with third parties or affiliates for marketing or promotional purposes.

Florida Health Justice Project may share limited information with service providers that assist us in delivering SMS communications, such as telecommunications carriers and messaging platform providers. These service providers may use the information only as necessary to provide messaging services on our behalf and are required to protect the confidentiality of the information.

Text messages may include case-related updates, appointment or meeting reminders, follow-up communications, requests for additional information, service-related notifications, responses to inquiries, and general communications related to Florida Health Justice Project programs and services.

Consent to receive SMS messages is voluntary and is not a condition of receiving services from Florida Health Justice Project. Message frequency may vary, and message and data rates may apply.
