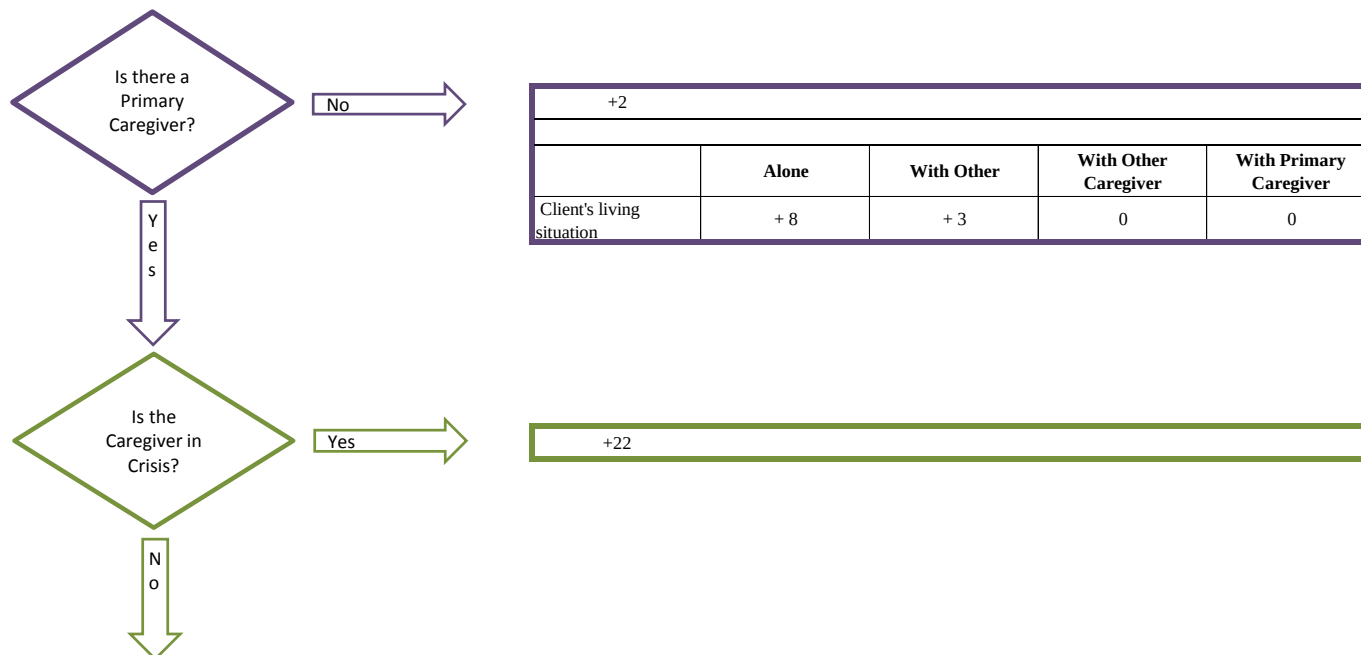


DOEA Priority Score Calculation
